All Knighton children are involved in the parade, please help your children to decide which country they would like to identify with and clothing to wear that represents something about that culture.



Coronavirus

You may be aware the end of the 14-day stay away period is approaching for many students and we are delighted to be welcoming back many of our students and families to school. We are very grateful for the 14-day self-isolation period that the small number of families returning from China have adhered to and the positive and caring way they have communicated with the school around this. A number of you may still be feeling worried about the Novel coronavirus. We need to continue to stress that there have been no confirmed cases of the Coronavirus in New Zealand. The final two people in guarantine, flown out by the Government from Wuhan that were tested yesterday, came back negative for the virus.

This 14-day self-isolation period for any person returning to New Zealand from China from the time of their arrival and the current travel ban affecting travel to and from China remains in place.
