This term we are welcoming back Andrew Campbell in his new role as Principal, we can't wait to see what exciting changes he brings and show him what cool Knighton Kids we are.


We have another busy term coming up, with lots of fun learning and extra activities. Bring it on! Here's some more information:

What's on when:

Our great office staff are happy to help you if you have any questions or need any assistance setting this up.

Medication - A reminder that a consent form must be filled in and left at the office for any medication administered at school. All medication remains in the office for safekeeping during the day.

Absence - if your child will be away from school, for whatever reason, please let the office know by ringing them, texting them, or using the school app. Please make sure your child is on time to school every day.
