Kia ora e te whaanau,

## Literacy

I will continue to choose writing themes that are of high interest to year 5 and 6 learners. Each student will also work on their individual writing learning intentions that were identified at the end of term 3. As a class we will also revisit learning intentions that multiple students have had difficulty with throughout the year.

School Journals, chapter books and readers will be sent home each week for you to read and discuss nightly with your child. If you are able to do this regularly it makes a huge difference to their learning.

#### Maths

The senior school continues to have maths in our cross-group classes every afternoon. The children are in class groups that suit their learning needs, challenge their thinking, extend their understanding of mathematics concepts and encourage them to work both independently and collaboratively to solve number and word problems.

## **Topic**

This term we will be completing activities that relate to the 6 Knighton values tūrangawaewae (belonging), angituu (success), hauora (well-being), auahatanga (creativity), manawaroa (resilience) and whakaute (respect). As part of our EOTC week, we will be visiting Kirikiriroa marae to learn about our local Waikato history and Māori tikanga during a pōwhiri, visiting Raglan Beach as part of our beach safety programme, and participating in a range of activities at Eastlink Sports.





Our trip to the Hamilton Garden's was certainly a highlight of Term 3. Many students celebrated their heritage during the Cultural Parade.
