School productions are part of our Arts Curriculum and are an ideal opportunity for our children to grow and develop their Knighton Way dispositions of Mahi Tahi/Getting Along, Whakarite/Being Organised, Whaikaha/Being Persistent, Maiatanga/Being Confident, and Kairapu/Being an Inquirer. For some of our children, school productions are a time when they can shine as it's something they love doing. This is great! For some other children, school productions can be a time when they feel out of their comfort zone and a little (or not so little) anxious. This is where we teach our children what it means to be confident and just give things a go without fear of failure. This is a very important and 'enabling' character for children to learn early in their life.

Senior School Production 'A Night in (Knighton) the Museum'

The immensely talented senior school tamariki/students will be entertaining audiences in the school Hall **4-7 September**.

What the story is about:

The senior kaiako/teachers decide to plan a trip to the museum to learn about aspects of world history.

The children, with their usual bunch of characters (and a bossy kaiako), discover how magical, fascinating, scary and wonderful history can be when the exhibits they visit come to life.

Pompeii, the Māori Battalion, the birth of Rock (music), Greenpeace and the Rainbow Warrior, the falling of the Berlin Wall, and the great Muhammad Ali all feature in this amazing trip through time.



Maths Challenge Stories by Room 10 Students

"It was wiki pāngarau/maths week and Mrs Lellieveld set us a challenge! Each class got given paper to make the longest paper chains, then we visited Room 9 and worked together to complete some maths activities with all those beautifully coloured paper chains!"

"My favourite part was working out how long the red paper chain was. I had to figure out how big of a step I had to take to make sure it was 1 metre and then I took 6 steps across the length of the red chain which meant it was 6 metres. Then I counted the chain was 14 lengths long, so to work out the final answer I solved out 6 x 14 using an algorithm which equals 84 metres."- **Dru**
