Last week, I went to the annual Normal And Model Schools (NAMSA) conference in Auckland. Knighton Normal School is one of twenty nine Normal and Model Schools around the country. To explain the reason why we're a 'normal' school, I've taken an extract out of the Normal and Model Schools website.

'Normal Schools have been in existence since the 16th Century when a group of schools in France became interested in preparing people for teaching. The French concept of "école normale" was to establish schools to model best teaching practices thereby setting a standard or norm for student teachers.'

In short, we partner up with the University of Waikato and some other Initial Teacher Education providers to help train Graduate Students to be teachers.
