Immunisation Update

Thank you for the 55 replies from last week's newsletter. We now have **150** students for which we have no documented evidence of their immunisation status. If you are one of these families your child will have already brought home a letter requesting this information. We need certified confirmation that your child has been fully immunised or at a minimum, that they have had two measles vaccines. These immunisation certificates are required to be presented to school urgently. If you have chosen not to immunise your child please also let us know.

Please be aware that should we have a confirmed case of measles, then the Medical Officer of Health will advise us on excluding students that haven't had two measles vaccines. This could potentially mean a prolonged period of absence from school.

Children arriving at school late (even by a few minutes) must be signed-in at the smiley window. Children will be signed in electronically by the office staff. All children's names are preloaded into our system. Children will be asked why they are late and their reasons will be entered into this system.
