Welcome back everyone to Term 2. I would like to give a special welcome to the new ākonga and whānau who joined our school this term. We hope you are all settling in well.

Last term we had 60% of our students attending school 'regularly'. Regular attendance is anything between 90 - 100% attendance for the term (equivalent to 5 days or less absence in a usual 10 week term). This was really pleasing for us as it was a big improvement on Term 1 last year where we had 45% regular attendance. While we understand there are valid and justified reasons for some tamariki not attending regularly, we know that regular attendance can be a significant factor in a child's academic and social success at school.

A friendly reminder that our upcoming Kahui Ako Teacher Only Day is on **Friday 30th May**. Our staff will be joining the other schools in our area for a day of Professional Development at Claudelands Events Centre. **School will be closed** for instruction on this day.


