This week we are celebrating Matariki. We have a number of events and activities planned for the week including vertical learning groups getting together to learn about **Matariki**, opportunities for shared kai,

Whāngai i te Hautapu, and Hui - a - kura/matariki moment on the courts on Thursday. Matariki marks the beginning of the Māori New Year (Te Tau Hou Māori). It represents a time of renewal and new beginnings, a time when we remember those who have passed away since the last Matariki, a time to plan for the future, and a time to connect with the environment.

There will be a Ministry of Education Accord **Teacher Only Day on Friday 12 September**. Please put this date in your calendar. School will be closed for instruction on the day. This is the last Teacher Only Day for the year and will be used for professional development around the new curriculum. More information and further reminders will come out next term.

Next term there will be **elections for school boards**. Every three years, all New Zealand state and state integrated schools hold elections for their school boards. The school board has an important function in governing the school. Nominations for the school board close on Wednesday 6 August with elections being held on Wednesday 10 September. The new board will take office on Wednesday 17 September. We have engaged with SchoolEd to oversee the election process. More information will be out soon.

At the end of this term we will be farewelling Briar Lynch who will be taking up a permanent teaching role at Hillcrest Normal School. Briar started teaching at Knighton at the beginning of 2013 and has recently been doing teacher release in the Senior School. We wish Briar all the best for her new adventure and we will miss her a lot.

We are looking forward to our annual **Parent Conversations** next week. This is an opportunity for you to meet with your child's teacher face to face and share the wonderful learning they have been taking part in and discuss next steps for them.

As this is a nine week term, this newsletter will be the last one for Term 2.


