And here we are - show week! The Showquest team is bursting with excitement.

Thursday will be a massive day for our children. They will need to arrive at school at their usual time by 9am. The tamariki will check in with their kaiako and meet us (Ms A and Mrs GW in A26 and the Hall).

The tamariki will remain with the kaiako and supervising adults for the day until they are collected either after the Junior performances or the prizegiving which is at the end of the senior performances. Times depend on how long the performances go on for. Junior performances are likely to be complete by 7.30pm. Prize giving is likely to be finished by 9.30pm. Tamariki cannot leave the premises during the day and parents are unable to visit during the day either.

Tamariki should be dressed comfy for the day with footwear on.

Tamariki will need to bring the following on the day:

- Their manners and their listening ears
- A big lunch and food for dinner (there is no way to heat food)
- A big drink of WATER ONLY
- Their own comb or hair brush
- Something quiet to do - colouring in, book to read, look and finds, small card game or board game...
- Something loose and warm to wear over their costume - that easily goes over their head so that it does not affect the make up or hair.
- It is a good idea for children to wear a singlet or crop top under their costume if they have one - especially those who have a quick change (children know if that is them)

We may order pizzas to top up their dinner. Please email below if you would prefer your child does not have any pizza. We will be ordering some plain cheese and some vegetarian for those who need it.
