# Newsletter 10 22 July 2025


Welcome back everyone to Term 3. I can't believe we're already into the second half of the academic year. A special welcome to all the new children and their families who started here this term. We hope your tamariki are settling into school life here well and that you have been made to feel a part of our school community.

This term we welcomed back Anne Hoare who is taking the new 'Roll Growth' class of New Entrants, Amy Thomas who is working as a Release Teacher in A30 and A31, and Whaea Tee who is working as a Kaitiaki in Te Hihiri.

Late last term a team of approximately 70 students took part in Show Quest, a major nationwide performing arts competition, held at Claudelands Arena. The children spent two terms, in their own breaktimes, rehearsing for this. We're thrilled to say that Knighton Normal School won the Waikato Junior Competition and we are now part of the New Zealand wide competition. The kids were absolutely amazing on the night and represented our kura so well. A huge thank you to Nicole, Pauline, Briar, Jane, Amber, Ally, and Manaia from our staff who all contributed to and worked with the cast. Auahatanga/Creativity is something we value strongly in our Knighton Way. It was great to be able to provide this opportunity for our ākonga to showcase their creativity on this platform.

It was really pleasing to see we had 64% of our students attending school regularly (90 - 100%) last term. This has certainly improved from Term 2 2023 where we had 18% attending regularly and Term 2 2024 where we had 47% attending regularly. While we understand there are justified reasons for children not attending school, we also know that regular attendance helps children with their learning. Thank you for your continued support and cooperation with this.

Some of you may have noticed roadworks along Knighton Road lately. Over the next few months, Waipa Civil will be putting new pipes underneath the footpath along Knighton Road. You will need to think of alternative places to drop off and/or pick up your children during this time. Using Henry Street and the Hillcrest Baptist Church carpark are two great and easy alternatives.



Nominations close soon for the **elections for school boards**. Every three years, all New Zealand state and state integrated schools hold elections for their school boards. The school board has an important function in governing the school. Nominations for the school board close on <u>Wednesday 6 August</u> with elections being held on <u>Wednesday 10 September</u>. The new board will take office on Wednesday 17 September. We have engaged with SchoolEd to oversee the election process. Nomination forms are available at the school office.
