Last week we had a team from the Education Review Office on site. The team visited classes, spoke with the Board of Trustees, children, parents and staff. On Thursday afternoon, the team gave some feedback to the BOT.

Some comments they made about our amazing staff were focussed on the:

- -Well-rounded programmes that look at the whole child (reading, writing math, KNS Way, opportunities etc)
- -How students were able to articulate the KNS Way competencies- the reviewers heard this reflected in the language of classes.
- -The positive relationships between teacher / child
- -High level of learner engagement
- -Bi cultural context reflected in class programme and language
- -Teachers making deliberate acts to support children.
- -Inclusive practice- significant support from our learning assistants ensuring success for all.
- -Positive partnerships with whanau,
- -Clear communication between home and school
- -Responsive practice according to need
- -Strong transitions across the school.

I look forward to sharing the full report when we receive it later in the year.
