Welcome back!

It is amazing to be back at school! We have missed the children so much. Our focus over the next few weeks is on rebuilding relationships, having fun and reminding the children of our expectations at Knighton.

We understand that children will have a range of emotions, from excitement at being back with their friends, to nervous at being around others, to struggling with getting back to school routines. We will be flexible, caring and kind.

Good hygiene practice everywhere is key wash and dry your hands often, cough or sneeze into your elbow and clean surfaces regularly.

We have been working closely with the school cleaners and the school caretaker. Surface cleaning of high use areas and toilet areas is a focus. All class spaces have sanitiser, soap, paper towels and spray for surfaces.

Drop off, Pick ups and visitors to site:

Please do not enter the school grounds unless absolutely necessary.

If you enter school grounds a staff member will collect your contact details. The reason that we have set up these steps is so that we can contact trace visitors that enter the school grounds. We will monitor the pick up process over the first few days and will make changes if needed.



New Entrant Morning and Play @ Knighton

While we are in Alert Level 2 the Thursday afternoon PlayGroup enrolled for pre-schoolers will not take place. However we encourage parents to continue to enrol their child as early as possible so we can place them into one of the four New Entrant classes. Parents will then be contacted to arrange visits to the class at a time to suit them and the class teacher. This could be one or many visits depending on the child's needs.

There will be no Open Morning this term but about Knighton information School available on our website and facebook page and we welcome inquiries either in person or by email or phone. We will continue to keep in contact with the pre-schools in our school zone.

Learning

A major focus for the next seven weeks is going to be on building relationships, routines and focussing on well being. Level Two at Knighton

Please remember these key points:

Hygiene- Remind your child about washing their hands, coughing into their elbow and staying out of others 'warm breath'.

Drop off - ALL gates open at 8.30am. We are encouraging you to drop your children off or let them walk to school. If parents need to come through the gates we will be taking their details. If you need to enter a classroom the teacher will be taking your name. We will only allow two parents in rooms at a time. Pick up- Gates open at 2.45pm. Remember to talk to your child about where you will be meeting them. If you need to come into the school grounds we will be taking your details. We will be monitoring the pick up time. If necessary we will move to a staggered pick up, based on surnames.

Please Remember

The Ministry of Health has stated that any child (or member of staff) who is coughing, sneezing, has a runny nose or a temperature needs to be sent home and possibly tested.
