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

Literacy

I will continue to choose writing themes that are of high interest to year 5 and 6 learners. The students will practise a range of different genres with links to other curricular activities. Each student will also work on their individual writing learning intentions that were identified at the end of term two.



School Journals, chapter books and readers will be sent home each week for you to read and discuss nightly with your child. If you are able to do this regularly it makes a huge difference to their learning.

Topic

The Wonder Project – During this programme Room 2 has been lucky enough to be assigned an engineer who will join us in class once a week. Together we will look to complete 13 modules that will give your child real world science experiences, as we build up towards blasting off our bottle rockets.

Blue Bots – As a class we will discuss how robots/machines work using a code written by a person. (Understand that robots are made by people to help people). We will then use the schools 6 Blue Bots to practice our ability to write codes and get them out of different mazes.

K.O.S – With the help of a curriculum provided by the New Zealand Police each student will receive the senior version of Keeping Ourselves Safe.

Maths

The senior school continues to have maths in our cross-group classes every afternoon. The children are in class groups that suit their learning needs, challenges their thinking, extends their understanding of mathematics concepts and encourages them to work both independently and collaboratively to solve number and word problems.
