Dear Knighiton Inline Hockey Families

Please find attached the draw for the first week of school league inline hockey. This can also be accessed through the Hamilton Inline Hockey Club web page <https://hamiltondevils.co.nz/games/school-league/>.

Where: The rink is located at the Eastlink Sports Centre, 30 Old Farm Rd (Next to the tennis courts). Games are approximately 20 minutes long. **You will need to be at the rink 10-15 minutes before the game** to ensure you have the equipment you need.

Equipment:

Players require a caged helmet (bike helmet is ok but a mouth guard must be worn if using a bike helmet), rollerblades and a stick.

Rollerblades can be borrowed at no cost from the rink. Some caged helmets and sticks are available at the rink but these will be in limited supply. It is a good idea to borrow equipment for the first few games, but then *players are encouraged to purchase their own equipment*.

The hockey club is happy to lend out their equipment for a game, but they ask you to please look after their helmets, skates and sticks. They also ask you to please help to keep the facilities clean, tidy and safe. This includes the changing rooms, the benches and the bleachers.

Please read the following notes from the club:

- You will find changing room numbers on the draw. This is for schools to use. Please use them.
- Please limit the number of parents on the players' bench. You should have a coach and manager on the bench and the remaining parents should be over on the seating area behind the net. This is for the safety of everyone.
- Pucks can be dangerous when they hit someone on the head. Please make sure that all players keep their helmets on at all times when they are on the players' bench.
- Please make sure your team returns all gear back to the skate room and the sticks in the container.
