DRAMATIC INQUIRY

We worked so hard on our Mantle of the Expert last term to complete our commission. We will be spending a short amount of time looking back and reflecting on our experience, and using the guise of being newspaper reporters to write some reflective articles.

We will also be looking at the Zones of Regulation in more detail this term. This is a new programme to our school that we are exposing our tamariki to, it will be in place from the beginning of next year too. It is linked to children being able to recognise, understand and regulate their emotions and reactions. We will be using process drama to launch this programme in Ruma Wha.

LITERACY

We will be working as a class this term to unpack the novel 'Wonderstruck'. The themes throughout the book are many and the learning we will be doing about the world and about reading through this book is exciting too. We will also continue the reading aspects of Daily 5 in our reading programme.



We will be basing our writing in our dramatic inquiry and looking closely at personification. We will be writing regularly based on a number of different prompts to continue to build our fluency and joy for writing. We will be using lessons from Catch Up Your Code to refresh ourselves with a number of spelling rules each day.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

We will be continuing our focus on the skills in Ki-O-Rahi - which involve throwing, catching, running, weaving, shooting, defending, team work and team communication.

We will be swimming again this term. I would like to remind you that this is part of our learning curriculum and we would like all children to participate in our swimming programme. If your child is unable to swim on a particular day please provide a note,



email or message on Dojo to let me know. Our swimming days are Monday and Thursday. Please help your child to remember their togs on those days.

MATHS

This continues to be taught through the PR1ME programme and is cross-grouped across our entire senior team. We have maths every day 1.30-2.30pm. If you have any questions around your child's maths it is best to contact their maths teacher directly. If you are unsure who that is or how to contact them please let me know and I can forward on your questions.

EXTRA NOTICES


