This morning we were treated to an amazing





Zones of Regulation

During this term our teachers have been introducing a way of thinking that encourages children to reflect on how they are feeling, how they react to situations and how their actions impact on others.

The approach that we are using is called the 'Zones of Regulation'.

There are four zones- blue, green, yellow and red.



Smart Watches and phones:

We understand that for some of our children it is important to have a communication device. For example some children catch a bus after school and need to contact their parents. If your child brings a phone to school it is important to remind them to drop their phone off to the office or class teacher and then pick it up after school. If a child needs to make a phone call during the day they can speak to a teacher who can organise the use of a school phone.
