Some useful information for the start of the 2021 year!

<u>School Website and App</u>: please check them out for all newsletters, term dates and up-coming events. You can also use the KNS app on your phone to report absences.

<u>Absences</u>: If your child is sick or is not coming to school please let the office know - text or phone 027 352 2089 to leave your message, or use the phone app. The school will follow up all unexplained absences. If you are late (after 9.00am) you must check in at the 'Smiley Face' window first.

<u>Medication</u>: If your child requires medication to be taken at school, please take this directly to the office where you will need to fill out a consent form. Teachers do not administer medicines.

<u>Sunsafe</u>: We actively promote the school's Sunsafe Policy. Children will wear their school hat every day in terms 1 and 4. The hats stay at school all term. They can be bought at the office. If your child goes to KASP after school can you consider buying them a separate hat to remain with them.

<u>Swimming</u>: We swim in Terms 1 and 4. We expect all children to participate unless they are sick and they bring a note. Wear suitable clothing for easy undressing and bring a waterproof bag for wet togs and towel.

<u>Stationery</u>: We will send home a stationery notice - exercise books and other stationery will be issued following payment. To avoid office queues, and to ensure your payments are accounted for correctly, we encourage all families to pay school costs online through our Kindo shop. If you do not already have a Kindo account, go to <u>www.mykindo.co.nz</u> or via the link on our school website. There are no fees for Kindo payments unless you choose to use a credit card. Using a Kindo account is the most efficient way to pay - and you don't need to send any paper forms back to school, so nothing gets lost in school bags.

Junior Assembly: Friday at 9.10 am. You are most welcome to join us, in the school hall.

Bookbags: Your child's bookbag and a reading book will be sent home each night. Please return these the next day.

Internet Safety: If I do not have an Internet Safety form for your child I will send one home with them. Can you please return it to the 'Smiley Face' window. The information about your child's photo, name and work on the Internet is particularly important and means their photo and work can be used on Seesaw and at school assemblies.

<u>Faculty of Education Placements</u>: During the term we will have student teachers in our class, on a weekly basis, as part of the Graduate Teacher Education course. They will have teaching tasks from the University to complete as well as taking part in our own class teaching programme. We may also have the Bachelor of Teaching students working in classes for up to eight weeks at a time for their teaching practicums.

<u>Classroom Release Time (CRT)</u>: Teachers are released from classroom teaching for two days every term. This time is used for testing and working with individual children, resource and planning preparation, as well as Professional Development. We usually try to have the same reliever each time to ensure continuity of the class programme.

Drop Off and Pick Up: Please try to arrive at school between 8.30am and 8.50am – this allows time for unpacking school bags. There will be no teachers on duty before 8.30am as it is the teachers' preparation and meeting time. We welcome parents into the class to see children's work before and after school but please wait outside in the morning until 8.30am. Thank you.
