Covid 19 restrictions

Meet the Teacher and whānau picnic tomorrow have been postponed due to Covid restrictions under alert level 2.

We have received the following advice from Ministry of Education regarding children's attendance at school:

At Alert Level 2 schools are open and everyone should be attending. The exceptions are anvone who is either:

- Unwell.
- Self-isolating (at the request of health authorities).
- Waiting for COVID test results (but only if advised by health authorities that they can't return to school until the test result comes back).

Unless recent visitors to Auckland and Taranaki have been at contact tracing locations of interest at the times specified in the Ministry of Health website, or meet one of the above criteria, students should be attending school.

Nut allergies

NZ Income Support may also be able to offer support in this regard.
