

#### Kia ora e te whānau

### **TE TIKANGA O KNIGHTON**

Our Knighton Way tikanga this term is 'Whaikaha - Persistence'. We encourage our tamariki to never give up and keep trying to do their best. It is also important that our tamariki know what to do when things are hard and can problem solve through any challenge. Some of the mātāpono that our tamariki will be putting into practice while expressing whaikaha are manawa tītī - determination, manawa roa - endurance and manawa piharau - hard worker.

### WHĀNAU HUI

This term our whānau hui will be held on Taite 12 o Akuhata at 5.30pm in Te Pupuke. This is a good opportunity for whānau to meet kaiako and our new tumuaki if they are new to Te Hihiri and share any whakaaro about upcoming events with kaiako.

### **WHARE PUKAPUKA**

Library day for Te Whāinga is every Tūrei at 2.30pm. Tamariki are encouraged to take library books home each week.

## **KAUPAPA MATUA**

This term our kaupapa is focused on learning about Māori and Pākehā worldviews around rākau, or timber and harakeke. More specifically we are going to explore native rākau and harakeke to understand the uses and tikanga practices associated with these taonga. In addition to that for Te Reo Matatini we will continue learning oro arapū (alphabet sounds), and kūoro (syllables), but will include oropuare roa (long vowel sounds), oropuare pūrua (vowel diagraphs) and whānau huarite (rhyme families) to further develop decoding skills and spelling words. Running parallel with that will be the development of comprehension skills for pānui through asking and responding to questions in more depth. As a follow on from last term we are going to continue building on skills that help us to write instructions and simple descriptions about people or objects. In our PR1ME pāngarau programme we will be learning about subtraction, ordinal numbers, positioning, and

working with numbers to 20 & 40 in a range of different ways. Our hākinakina programme this term will be based on Ngā mahi a Rēhia through tītītōrea and tī rākau.
