Hearing and Vision testing

Vision Hearing Technicians from Community and Southern Rural Health will be visiting our school on Tuesday 10th August. The objective of the test is to identify previously undetected vision and hearing defects for students who have not previously been tested. But if any parents/caregivers **do not** want their child to be checked, or their child is currently under specialist care for a vision or hearing defect, they should let the school office know.

What tests are carried out?

<u>Ears</u>

Audiometry (hearing test)

Tympanometry – middle ear function test (only carried out when hearing test is not within a normal range)

<u>Eves</u>

Long distance vision tests – not a complete visual examination, but a simple screening test All of these checks are non-invasive, safe and should cause no discomfort.
