<u>**Kindo**</u> To avoid office queues, and to ensure your payments are accounted for correctly, we encourage all families to pay school costs online through our Kindo shop. If you do not already have a Kindo account, go to <u>www.mykindo.co.nz</u> or via the link on our school website. There are no fees for Kindo payments unless you choose to use a credit card. Using a Kindo account is the most efficient way to pay - and you don't need to send any paper forms back to school, so nothing gets lost in school bags. *School stationery packs will be issued after payment is received.* 

> <u>Sunhats</u> - All children are required to wear their Knighton School sunhat this term when outside. They will be kept at school. Please give your child a separate hat for KASP - it doesn't have to be the Knighton one. Knighton School hats can be purchased from the school office for \$10.00. These must be worn in terms 1 and 4.

#### Important notes to remember:

- Please remember to bring a **water** bottle to school each day so that we can keep it in the classroom and have access to a drink when they need it. Please make sure these are clearly named.
- All students need to bring their **book bags** and home learning books to school every day and <u>they</u> are responsible for putting their books away in the morning <u>before</u> the bell rings.
- Seesaw- It would be wonderful to have all families connected to our classes
  Seesaw it is the main platform for sharing messages or photos from our day.
  This is only available to the parents within our class and we would like to be
  able to share group photos, videos and messages with you.
- Home learning-Reading books come home most nights. Poem books and library books on Friday. There are letter, word and number charts for learning and sharing. Remember to check Seesaw for photos to talk about.
- Please could children come to school with **sunscreen** applied. We do have sunscreen in the classroom for them to re-apply during the day.

<u>Swimming</u> - We will swim every Tuesday and Thursday until the end of the term. We expect all children to participate unless they are sick and they bring a note. Please ensure they wear suitable clothing for easy undressing and bring a waterproof bag for wet togs and towel.

Library: Our Library day is Thursday. Please make sure you return your previous week's library book so we can issue a new one.
