Women's Suffrage - Pay Equity

Women's Suffrage Day is this Thursday 19 September. Since 2017 NZEI have been working through the process of negotiating with the Ministry of Education for pay equity for our school support staff — Learning Assistants, Office Staff and Librarians.

These staff are very underpaid for the work they do, in fact, when the minimum wage went up earlier this year the bottom four tiers of the pay

rates had to be immediately adjusted so they didn't sink below the minimum wage rate. We ask for a show of support for them by wearing black and white this Thursday 19 September.



Immunisation Certification

We currently have approximately 200 students for which we have no documented evidence of their immunisation status. If you are one of these families your child will have already brought home a letter requesting this information. We need certified confirmation that your child has been fully immunised or at a minimum, that they have had two measles vaccines. These immunisation certificates are required to be presented to school urgently. If you have chosen not to immunise your child please also let us know.

Please be aware that should we have a confirmed case of measles, then the Medical Officer of Health will advise us on excluding students that haven't had two measles vaccines. This could potentially mean a prolonged period of absence from school.
