Tena koutou katoa.

As you will be aware, there seems to be some positive momentum with the teachers and principal negotiations with the Government over resourcing, pay equity, needs support and conditions of work. The Ministry of Education has agreed to our union, NZEI, holding Paid Union Meetings tomorrow afternoon 31st May so teachers can discuss the latest government offer and vote on it. I will update the community on how this is progressing.

As I mentioned earlier in the term, we are focusing on our Knighton Way and what it means to our tamariki. The term 'The Knighton Way' was created around 2009. It was often noticed by the community, and people who came to visit the school, that Knighton children were very respectful and friendly, and when we were asked why that was, our response was it's just the Knighton Way.

The Knighton Way has five Pou that represent dispositions that we believe will set our children up for success. The first disposition is **Mahi Tahi/Getting Along**. We feel it's important for children to learn to relate to lots of people in a variety of contexts. The multicultural nature of our school enables children to do that. Mahi Tahi/Getting Along includes being socially responsible, playing by the rules, thinking first, accepting others, valuing cultures, and learning to be cooperative and collaborative.

Over the last two weeks, we've had children representing Knighton Normal School at the South East Hamilton Primary Schools Winter Sports Day, the Morrinsville Netball and Rugby Fun Day, Rippa Rugby, and Kī o Rahi. As Principal, it's been lovely to receive feedback from parents and the wider community about how respectful and friendly our Knighton kids were at these events.



Sade Kaipara-Morrison is a Tania Dalton Foundation scholarship recipient and as a way of paying it forward into her community, she chose to donate these balls to Knighton School.

Hillcrest Kahui Ako Attendance Initiative

Kahui Ako = Community of Learning. Schools and kura in the Hillcrest Kahui Ako are those within the Hillcrest, Tamahere, Tauwhare, Matangi, Newstead, Knighton and Peachgrove communities

As part of a new Ministry of Education initiative, the government has provided our Kahui Ako funding to partner with **Bluelight** to support attendance in our school. Bluelight works in partnership with the police to support our tamariki (children) to attend school.

In line with the Government's focus on attendance, we now inform the NZ Police Bluelight Truancy Services of any student who's absence is greater than 30% of the year to date.

Let's work together as a community to recognise the significance of regular attendance at school. Together, we can empower our children, strengthen our communities, and build a future filled with endless possibilities.

- * Vision Hearing Technicians will be visiting our school on Tuesday 30th May. The objective of the test is to identify previously undetected vision and hearing defects.

If any parents/caregivers <u>do not</u> want their child to be checked, or their child is currently under specialist care for a vision or hearing defect, they should let the school know.

The technicians will check children who have not completed vision and hearing checks as part of their Before School Check, and children absent from previous visits or require retests or follow up.

All of these checks are non-invasive, safe and should cause no discomfort.
