Our main focus for the term will be our Senior School Production - A Night in (Knighton) the Museum. All children will

be involved in our production either on stage or behind the scenes. You will hear more about this as the term progresses, especially in regards to costuming and ticket sales! If your child is in the

cast, they have already been rehearsing with me regularly and are doing an AMAZING job! We cannot wait for the production to come to fruition.

We will continue our journey into the Critical Histories of New Zealand using dramatic inquiry as a vehicle to unpack all the awesome thinking we will be doing. We will be tapping into more and more of our local history.

Our haerenga (journey) with te reo Māori continues and we will continue to begin our days immersing ourselves in te reo Māori in various ways. Also with continuing support from our Learning Assistant Whaea Vicki the children will also continue to grow their NZSL kete. Our NZSL Tutor Hayley comes in every Friday morning to work with us too.

We attend TOPA every Friday and are having heaps of fun learning about the cultures of the Pacific Islands from our tutors: Landy, Jake and Jordan. What an invaluable experience we get to have with them each week.

Tuhituhi (writing) and pānui (reading) form a part of our daily programme in many ways. We will be using the SRA programme this term to build our independence

with decoding text and comprehension in reading. We will also be looking closely at the surface features of our writing - spelling, punctuation and paragraphing

We will continue our cross-grouping for maths. As a class in week 4 we will have an opportunity to dig a little deeper into financial literacy when ASB visits our kura to have two sessions with us completing the Get Wi\$e programme with us.

Each child in the senior school has their own log in to Google within the school network. They can share the things they are doing in the Drive by logging in at home too.

I use Seesaw to share many of the great things that we are doing in the classroom and beyond, I also share messages or announcements. The site is safe, locked down and private and is only accessible to the people I share it with (our whānau). If you do not want your child's photo or work shared on the site or have questions please come and talk with me or flick me an email, hopefully I can alleviate any concerns people may have. It is very important that you are connected to this, as we try to share information with you in a timely manner, sometimes Seesaw will be the best and quickest way to get the information to you.

Fitness will form the key part of our Phys Ed programme this term. We will be looking forward to the cross country mid-term and building our fitness skills in anticipation of it.


