Puppet Show

Hearing & Vision Testing - 10th August

Vision & Hearing Technicians will be visiting our school on Thursday 10 August. The objective of the test is to identify previously undetected vision and hearing defects.

If any parents/caregivers <u>**do not**</u> want their child to be checked, or their child is currently under specialist care for a vision or hearing defect, they should let the school know.

The technicians will check children who have not completed vision and hearing checks as part of their Before School Check, and children absent from previous visits or who require retests or follow up.

All of these checks are non-invasive, safe and should cause no discomfort.



Lost Property

Please come and look through the lost property outside Mrs Cowie's office regularly. Named items can be returned to children but unfortunately most of the clothing that is lost by children is unnamed.

All unnamed belongings that are not claimed are donated to a second hand shop.

Parents and Caregivers who need to take children out of school for appointments need to sign them out at the office **before** going to collect the child from their classroom. The leave pass needs to be handed to the class teacher so they know they are leaving the premises. This is for safety reasons.

Office staff try to keep calls to classrooms to a minimum during class time as teachers are focussed on teaching and phone calls can be disruptive. Unless it is an emergency please make after school arrangements with children before school.

Reminders

- → Change of clothes: Please make sure your child has a change of clothes in their school bag, they may get wet and muddy playing on the field in the break times, as well as occasional toileting accidents.
- → Updating contact details: If you have changed your address, email address or contact phone numbers please let the office know. It is very important we are able to contact families, especially if your child is unwell. We also need an emergency contact person for every student.
- → Returning sports/event uniforms: Please return Knighton uniforms from Term 1 & 2 if your child is no longer taking part in an activity this term.
