Literacy

I will continue to choose writing themes that are of high interest to year 5 and 6 learners. Each student will also work on their individual writing learning intentions that were identified at the end of term 3. As a class we will also revisit learning intentions that multiple students have had difficulty with throughout the year.

School Journals, chapter books and readers will be sent home each week for you to read and discuss nightly with your child. If you are able to do this regularly it makes a huge difference to their learning.

Maths

The senior school continues to have maths in our cross-group classes every afternoon. The children are in class groups that suit their learning needs, challenge their thinking, extend their understanding of mathematics concepts and encourage them to work both independently and collaboratively to solve number and word problems.

Topic

This term Akomaunga 31 will be learning about the important role water plays on our planet, and study our local waterways. We will also be completing a range of experiments from the House of Science - Wonderful Wai kit. As part of this unit, Room 31 will be visiting the Hamilton Gardens to judge the New Zealand Rose of the Year. Followed by an afternoon trip to the Ruakura Berry Farm on Thursday 9th November. This will give our tamariki a firsthand experience of how produce is grown in our local community. A Notice asking for permission and parent helpers will be sent home later this term.
