Road Safety

Before and after school it is very busy around school and our patrolled crossings. Recently we had an incident where a child was knocked over on Knighton Road so this is a good reminder for those walking and driving around school to be cautious.

Road patrollers are trained so they can assist children to cross on Knighton Road, Clyde Street, Wairere Drive and Henry Street. We ask that parents and caregivers also follow their instructions and cross at the designated area when dropping off and collecting students.

If students are coming to school on scooters or bikes remember they must wear a helmet.

Our year 1 children recently took part in a Safe Walking Programme with Rueben the Road Safety Bear. They learnt how to safely cross the road and look out for sneaky driveways.
